BRISTOL HARBOR IS ON THE LIST OF THE TOP TEN HARBORS

Bristol Harbor has been listed as #4 on US **Harbors 2024 List of Best Harbors**



US Harbors, which provides tidal and coastal weather data, has announced the winners of their 5th annual contest to find the "Best Harbor" in the U.S. This crowdsourced contest, open to the public for voting, is held online each year to assess the favorite harbor out of the 1500+ harbors for which US Harbors provides services. Communities with the most passion

for where they live, boat, and fish generally end up winning the event, and the 2024 winners include several new harbors that were not previously in the winners' circle. Top 10 Results:

- 1. Block Island, RI (also 2024's Northeast regional winner; first time on winners list)
- 2. Destin, FL (also 2024's Gulf Coast regional winner; first time on winners list)
- 3. Padanaram, MA (2019 "Best Harbor" Grand Winner)
- 4. Bristol, RI (first time on winners list)
- 5. Shelter Cove, Hilton Head, NC (also 2024's Southeast regional winner; and Southeast regional winner in 2022 and 2021)
- 6. Pillar Point, Princeton, CA (2024's Pacific Coast regional winner; first time on winners list)
- 7. Gloucester, MA (first time on winners list)
- 8. Charlevoix, MI (2021 "Best Harbor" Grand Winner; also 2024's Great Lakes regional winner)
- 9. Brookings, OR (first time on winners list)
- 10. Depoe Bay, OR (2022 "Best Harbor" Grand Winner

EBSF's summer is off and Sailing! We had a beautiful evening for the Youth orientation for Parents on June 14th. The


large crowd enjoyed learning about what to expect this summer of sailing. Instructors were introduced, and topics were

Anna Mary



Have you ever wondered how a particular boat acquired its name?

Peter Canzone asks this question each month to a BYC member and provides the answer in this column.

Anna Mary is a Gray 32 owned by Mike and Denise Martel

Why the name *Anna Mary*?

The answer is best described in Mike's own words:

Built in 1928 by Gray Boats in Thomaston, Maine, and currently named *Anna Mary* after our first grandchild (we have 5 now), our 32' single screw motorboat was designed by the late, noted

mid-coast Maine designer Albert E. Condon. She is 'Maine' through and through; her design is called a 'Lobster Cruiser', incorporating some design elements that are characteristic of working lobster fishing boats of the Maine coast. We aren't sure of her original name, but until recently she was known as *Tuva*, and under her most recent owner, *Tollie*. She is powered by a Ford Lehman 120hp 6 cyl. Diesel of 1970s vintage.

With 5 grandkids, 2 of them grandsons and the other 3 granddaughters, the question arose as to how we could be fair to all of them? We realized that we don't have a big enough transom to represent all of their names, so we simply decided to name the boat after our first grandchild and leave it at that.

Anna Mary is now on her mooring in Bristol Harbor and my plan is to run a little charter service with her, taking 6 passengers around the harbor and upper Narragansett Bay during the summer. These short 90-minute trips are intended to be relaxing tours of the sights and points of interest in the area, viewed from a graceful antique boat, originating at the Bristol Town Dock and, for the time being, ending there. We will also have hour-long sunset cruises. We are calling our enterprise BRISTOL CLASSIC CRUISES and have secured the domain BristolClassicCruises.com, which is a great start, but it is only the beginning, and we have much work to do.
